Our Projects

Project Highlight: Mwakishimba Primary School Transformation

Project country: Kenya

Overview

Nestled in Taita-Taveta County, Kenya, Mwakishimba Primary School has undergone an extraordinary transformation. Once on the brink of closure in 2017 due to neglect and inadequate facilities, it now stands as a beacon of hope and progress. This remarkable journey, led by the MIT Group Foundation, MIT staff, local leaders like former H.E. Governor Granton Samboja, and generous donors, showcases the power of collective action in reshaping education and uplifting communities.

Key Milestones

- 2017: MIT staff initiated a fundraiser to address the school's urgent needs.
- 2018–2019: Reconstruction began, leading to the completion of two classrooms.
- 2021: Five additional classrooms were completed, along with significant infrastructure upgrades, including a modern kitchen and digital tools.
- 2022: An MOU outlined further commitments to:
 - o Providing printers and computers (completed 2023)
 - o Constructing a modern kitchen (completed 2023)
 - o Building an administration block (completed 2024)
 - o Adding a laboratory (planned for 2025)
 - o Developing a dining hall and perimeter wall (planned for 2026)

Impact

Enhanced infrastructure and learning tools have transformed the school environment, improving educational outcomes and fostering a brighter future for students and staff.

Student Perspective:

Mwarenge, a student, shared that the printers and computers reduced costs for families and improved learning, while the modern kitchen ensures hygienic and efficient meal preparation. He expressed heartfelt gratitude for the support, calling it "a blessing for the school."

• Teacher Perspective:

Ms. Knight, a science teacher, highlighted the benefits of digital tools in enhancing literacy and reducing printing costs, the modern kitchen's efficiency, and the administration block's improved functionality. She noted the need for clean water to further support student well-being.

Project Highlight: Transforming Lives in Gaunkharka, Nepal

Project country: Nepal

Overview

In partnership with Sunrise Children's Association Inc. (SCAI), the MIT Group Foundation has embarked on a transformative three-year project in Gaunkharka, Nuwakot District, Nepal. This initiative, launched in 2023 with a budget of AUD 65,000, aims to improve education and livelihoods for 44 children and their families, fostering sustainable growth and self-reliance.

Key Objectives

- Enable vulnerable children to continue higher secondary education while living with their families.
- Reduce child labour, early marriage, and school dropouts.
- Equip youth for sustainable employment and career growth.
- Empower families to achieve financial independence and provide quality care for their children.

Achievements to Date

- Supported 40 students across school levels, vocational training, and college studies, including three enrolled in technical diploma programs.
- Delivered career counselling, life skills training, and emotional support, improving academic performance and confidence among students.
- Established a cooperative to support family livelihoods, enabling savings, loans, and business growth.
- Provided training in goat rearing, vegetable farming, and cooperative management, helping 37 families increase their income.

Impact on Children

Testimonies from students such as Mendo and Sachin Tamang highlight the program's life-changing effects. From receiving essential school supplies to career guidance, students now envision brighter futures in fields like agriculture and engineering.

Impact on Families

Families have benefited immensely, as evidenced by testimonies from parents and guardians. Training and cooperative loans have helped them start profitable ventures, such as goat and vegetable farming, significantly improving their annual income and living standards.

Future Plans

Looking ahead, the program will focus on:

- Expanding access to higher education through scholarships.
- Strengthening the cooperative for long-term self-sufficiency.
- Addressing pressing needs, such as access to clean water.

Project Highlight: Earthquake Relief and Reconstruction in Rukum and Jajarkot Project country: Nepal



Overview

In response to the catastrophic 6.4-magnitude earthquake that struck Nepal's Rukum and Jajarkot districts on 3 November 2023, the MIT Group Foundation, in collaboration with the Non-Resident Nepali Association (NRNA), launched a large-scale relief and reconstruction initiative. This collaborative effort has raised over NRs. 10 million to support immediate rescue operations, provide critical supplies, and lay the groundwork for rebuilding devastated communities.

Key Statistics

- Magnitude: 6.4 on the Richter scale.
- Lives Lost: Over 157 fatalities and an equal number injured.
- Houses Destroyed: More than 35,000 homes, including 442 houses in Aathbiskot Municipality and 28 completely destroyed in Lata Village.
- Affected Communities: Approximately 80% of the 63 homes in Rauth Village, Jajarkot, were severely damaged.
- Infrastructure Impact: Numerous schools, primary healthcare centres, and public facilities were destroyed.
- Funds Raised: NRs. 10 million, with equal contributions from MIT Group Foundation and NRNA.



Immediate Relief Efforts

- Relief Deployment: Two teams, led by Dr. Shesh Ghale and NRNA Youth Brand Ambassador Dipesh Khatri, delivered critical supplies, including 1,000 sets of blankets and essential food items, to the most affected areas.
- **Field Assessments:** Teams conducted comprehensive damage evaluations in Aathbiskot Municipality and Rauth Village, engaging with local representatives, earthquake survivors, and stakeholders to understand immediate and long-term needs.
- Impact on Communities: In Aathbiskot, 442 houses were damaged, including 28 completely destroyed in Lata Village, while Rauth Village in Jajarkot saw 80% of its 63 homes severely impacted

Reconstruction Initiatives

The MIT Group Foundation and the Global NRN Foundation are spearheading the rebuilding of 28 homes in Lata Village (Aathbiskot Municipality-13, Rukum Pashchhim). This project incorporates:

- Housing Reconstruction: Initial focus on 28 homes in Lata Village (Aathbiskot Municipality-13) and 63 homes in Rauth Village, using earthquake-resistant designs and local resources.
- Educational Support: Establishing a scholarship fund of Rs. 600,000 at Janajagaran Secondary School in Gaubari, supported by the Nepali diaspora in Belgium, to assist underprivileged and orphaned students affected by the disaster.
- **Community Development:** Partnering with local municipalities to integrate sustainable practices in rebuilding efforts, such as the use of local labour and tools.

Notable Stories of Resilience

During the relief mission, the team encountered profound human stories of survival and courage. These included:

- The rescue of two-month-old Ashvi BK, found alive under debris 12 hours after the earthquake.
- Engagements with survivors like Chandra Kami, who lost his mother and grandmother, underscoring the emotional toll on families.


Future Plans

- Rebuilding 63 homes in Rauth Village, Jajarkot, and continuing support for families displaced by the disaster.
- Enhancing local infrastructure, including schools and healthcare centres, to strengthen community resilience.
- Expanding livelihood training and cooperative support for affected households.

This project underscores the critical importance of collective action in disaster recovery. By pooling resources and expertise, the MIT Group Foundation and NRNA are paving the way for sustainable rebuilding, providing hope and security to affected communities.

Project Highlight: Establishment of MIT Australian Foundation Ltd

Project country: Australia

Overview

The MIT Group Foundation launched the MIT Australian Foundation Ltd, a charitable arm under the governance of the Melbourne Institute of Technology Pty Ltd. This foundation was formally registered in November 2021 and has been carefully structured to provide targeted support for vulnerable youth across Australia.

Purpose and Objectives

The primary mission of the MIT Australian Foundation Ltd is to provide relief to young individuals who are poor, destitute, sick, or living with a disability (referred to as Vulnerable Persons). The foundation achieves this through:

- **Funding Educational Materials:** Providing resources to enhance learning opportunities for vulnerable youth.
- Awarding Scholarships: Offering financial assistance to open pathways to education.
- Educational Programs: Organising activities and programs to enrich learning experiences.
- Life Skills Training: Equipping young individuals with the tools needed for personal and professional success.
- Supportive Activities: Complementing educational efforts with ancillary initiatives to uplift Vulnerable Persons.

Governance and Structure
